Introduction and scope

WMS is committed to providing a healthy and safe environment for all those involved in the musical activities it organises.

- Those involved include but are not limited to members, performers, volunteers and members of the public.
- Environments include but are not limited to rehearsals, concerts and fundraising events.

Responsibilities

Overall responsibility for WMS health and safety sits with the WMS Committee.

Statements of general policy

- 1. WMS will seek to prevent accidents and cases of ill-health by managing the health and safety at events and activities it organises using relevant risk assessments and a general awareness of health and safety conditions.
- 2. WMS will engage and consult with members and volunteers on health and safety conditions.
- 3. WMS will provide clear instructions and information to ensure that members, performers and volunteers are competent to do their work in a healthy and safe manner.
- 4. WMS will implement emergency procedures such as evacuation in case of fire or other significant incident, and first aid procedures where necessary.
- 5. WMS will maintain safe and healthy conditions, provide and maintain equipment, and ensure safe storage/use of equipment, including but not limited to choir staging.
